ROSARY CIRCLE FOR PRIESTLY VOCATIONS:- Given the not insignificant decline in priestly vocations and to encourage us all to pray for such vocations, we will begin a 'Rosary Circle' next month. This is a very simple spiritual exercise many of us could join in with; at least 20 people praying one decade of the Rosary each day, so the whole of the Rosary is prayed for this particular intention, thus creating a 'Rosary Circle'. Each month a new 'Rosary Circle Chart' would be on the church noticeboard listing the 20 decades of the Rosary and a number of columns for people to put their initial or a tick in the box to indicate they will pray the particular decade each day, to create a number of 'circles'.

To keep this spiritual exercise in our minds and hearts, the first Sunday of each month would be a 'sign up' weekend, when people can recommit to this by 'signing up again' or indeed take up this prayerful activity. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION MASS 23rd June:- This will take place on Sunday 23rd June, it will be an additional Mass to the day, at 12.00 mid-day as the number of guests will be significant. Anyone is welcome to come to the Mass, but please be mindful of the First Holy Communion children and their families. There will be the usual 8 & 10 am Masses that morning. On Saturday 29th May at the 6pm Mass the First Holy Commuion certificates will be given out followed by a Communion Breakfast in the hall.

The Criminal Justice Bill Report Stage debate and amendments to abortion laws, is going to be **on Wednesday 15 May** when MPs will be given the opportunity to vote on two pro-life changes to the law - one amendment tabled by Caroline Ansell MP to lower the abortion time limit from 24 weeks to 22 weeks - and another tabled by Liam Fox MP that would bring the abortion time limit for babies with Down's syndrome in line with the time limit for babies that do not have disabilities (as you likely know, abortion for Down's syndrome is currently legal right up to birth). MPs will also have the opportunity to vote on two extreme abortion up to birth amendments that have been tabled by pro-abortion MPs Stella Creasy and Diana Johnson.

Many lives are at stake here. Actions you take ahead of these votes, such as writing to your MP, will play a big part in persuading MPs to vote the right way. If you haven't already emailed your MP asking them to oppose the abortion up to birth amendments, you can write to them now using our easy-to-use tool by clicking here. (You should be able to get to this 'link' via the newsletter on the parish website, otherwise, simply type SPUC into a search engine, and you should be able to get to the campaign page.

New Lectionary: As of Advent 2024 a new translation of the Scriptures will be used at the behest of the Bishops Conference. It would therefore be advisable to wait until the new translation becomes available rather than purchasing any current publication e.g Sunday Missals.
